WHAT IS AUSTIN CHILD GUIDANCE CENTER?

Sometimes life is hard. When parents divorce, a teen may feel angry and isolated. When a child cannot sit still in school, he can be sent frequently to the principal's office. When a toddler has been abused, she may not trust her new foster parents. When a preschooler bullies his classmates, he could be kicked out of daycare. When a child is diagnosed with a mental illness, a parent can feel helpless and confused. When a grandparent dies, a teenager can feel lonely and might cry for weeks.

Sometimes it can be so overwhelming. Parents have tried everything and still can't make things better. When life is hard, Austin Child Guidance Center helps children and families deal with those challenges. We give them hope. We provide a safe place for families to talk with a therapist. Parents learn new skills and tools to help their children. We strive to help children and adolescents have successful lives at school, with friends, and with their family.

Austin Child Guidance Center is a community agency with expertise in children's mental health. Our unique team of professionals offers a variety of therapy and mental health services. Our psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, and counselors develop individualized treatment plans to help children and families navigate life.

In a group setting with their peers, children learn how to be a good friend, practice problem-solving, and build self-esteem. Groups are for preschoolers, 6-9 year olds, 9-12 year olds, and adolescents.

PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICES

41 Assessments and 18 Screened for ADHD Class

Sometimes children presenting with a multitude of problems that do not have a clear cause require in-depth psychological assessments to identify specific challenges and give treatment recommendations.

PSYCHIATRIC SERVICES

60 Evaluations and 65 Children Monitored

For clients who may benefit from the use of medication, a psychiatric evaluation is administered. If prescribed, medication is monitored for efficacy and side effects.

PARENT EDUCATION CLASSES

226 Parents

A variety of classes are offered including Enhancing the Parent-Child Relationship, Moving Through: Basic Tools for Divorcing Parents, and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) Parenting Class.



89% of children receiving counseling services showed improvement in their ability to function.





NEXT STEP

In partnership with LifeWorks, led therapy groups at Becker and Zavala Elementary and Fulmore Middle School to develop skills in resolving conflicts, expressing feelings in safe ways, and making good choices with 99 children.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES DIVISION

Collaborated with Travis County Juvenile Court to help reduce drug use among 111 14- to 16-year old juvenile offenders by providing therapy services, including multi-family groups.

TANDEM: MOVING FORWARD TOGETHER, A TEEN PRENATAL/PARENTING PROGRAM

Collaborated with People's Community Clinic to provide counseling to 17 teenage parents.

COMMUNITY PARTNERS FOR CHILDREN

Provided consultation to 110 children and family members in collaboration with public and private agencies to provide intensive case management to children who have multiple needs that cannot be met by one agency. The twice a month meetings are held at Austin Child Guidance Center.

CHILDREN'S VICTIM ASSISTANCE RECOVERY PROJECT

Treated 76 children and their families who were victims of or witnesses to crime or violence; supported by the Office of the Attorney General of Texas.

MENTAL HEALTH EVALUATION & TREATMENT SERVICES

Provided services to 24 victims of physical or sexual abuse or neglect referred by the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services.

TRAVIS COUNTY LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

Provided individual and group therapy to 67 adolescents at the Leadership Academy of the Gardner-Betts Juvenile Justice Center.

INFANT AND EARLY CHILDHOOD MENTAL HEALTH TRAINING AND OUTREACH PROGRAM

In collaboration with The University of Texas at Austin, graduate students are trained and supervised to work with infants and young children while also completing a service learning placement at local high-need childcare centers. Served 111 children and family members.
